Pats and CarMax Team Up to Donate \$10,000 to Foxborough Council on Aging

This May, the Patriots partnered with CarMax to donate \$10,000 to the Foxborough Council on Aging to help residents in need and create a brand-new craft center.

Of the \$10,000 donation, \$5,000 went to providing 50 local residents with \$100 grocery gift cards and Patriots swag bags that residents picked up during a special drive-through event. As part of the festivities, Pat Patriot attended the event to help distribute the gift bags, take photos and present Human Services Director Marc Craig and the Council on Aging with an additional \$5,000 donation that will be used to build a new craft center at the Foxborough Senior Center.





"We decided to make a real big impact with the funding and do something that would be incredibly felt in the community by giving each resident in need a \$100 gift card," Craig said. "We didn't tell anyone in advance how much the gift cards were for so when people pulled up, they were unbelievably excited and surprised, and really enjoyed meeting Pat Patriot as well."

In addition to the gift cards' impact on 50 residents, the new craft center will benefit countless

residents for years to come, helping cover the cost of a new three-dimensional printer and a cricket machine used to cut vinyl and wood designs to make signs and other special craft items. The funding will also allow the Council on Aging to fund an online class and virtual craft programs over the next year as they continue to welcome seniors back to in-person classes.

"This funding gave us an opportunity to buy some more expensive craft equipment that you wouldn't find at any other senior center," Craig said. "It's the machines themselves that are very expensive, so once we have them, there's a very low overhead cost to maintain them for years to come. We're excited to be able to create a special space that anyone in the community, not just seniors, can come in and enjoy."

"The people are the best part of living here," he said. "You would've thought I'd grown up here and my family was a staple in town with how welcomed we feel."

Bonfiglio and the team were recently honored by the Revolution as the Heroes of the Match at halftime of the Revs' game against the Columbus Crew. In addition to the in-stadium recognition, each member of the team received a customized Revolution kit, including a jersey, shorts, and cleats. The Revs also donated state-of-the-art, durable sets of crutches to the athletes to aid them in competition, as part of a long-term commitment to support the team.



"We're blessed to have the Revolution backing us and letting us get out there and play," Bonfiglio said. "It meant the world to us to be honored by them because we're trying to get the word out and let other people know about the

team. It's nice to not feel different and be part of a team with a goal to strive to achieve together."

The team recently beat the Red Bulls' Amputee Soccer Team 3-1 and is continually working to grow and expand the league to compete throughout the country.

Besides enjoying an unparalleled experience at the draft itself, Mike

and Helene also made the most of their time in Cleveland, visiting the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, dining at some great local restaurants and partaking in draft festivities throughout the city. The couple returned home to Foxborough that Saturday morning with memories that will last them a lifetime.

"We've never won an experience like this one, but we've been in town a long time and feel really fortunate and grateful for anything that the Patriots organization has to offer, never mind a trip of this magnitude," Helene said. PARTNERS IN PATRIOTISM FUND PIP Fund Supports Foxborough Community Initiatives

PIP FUND SUPPORTS NEW ART AND NATURE CONSERVATION PASSPORT PROGRAM

Nicole Vachon Hanlon created the Foxborough Art and Nature Conservation Passport as a way to encourage residents to explore Foxborough's natural beauty while fostering their creativity. Recognizing the importance of this effort, the PIP Fund granted her project \$700 to cover the cost of printing 200 full-color passports.

"I first began this project because I was inspired from finding conservation lands I didn't know about that were just a five to 10-minute drive from my house," Hanlon said. "As an artist during the pandemic, I struggled to sell my paintings or get my art out there, so I created this project to help others connect with these great conservation lands and to support artists as well. It is so exciting that PIP is now supporting me to create a way to reach out to even more folks that don't have electronic access and provide a way to unplug and explore and get excited about nature and art!"

Interested participants can pick up a passport at the Boyden Library, Town Hall, Lane Learning Center and the Senior Center. These detailed passports will enable visitors to answer questions, explore the trails and create artistic field notes and sketches during their visit. The program made its grand opening on June 26 at the Lane Learning Center and there will be opportunities throughout the summer to utilize the passport individually or through guided family scavenger hunts in partnership with the Boyden Library.

FOXBORO RECREATION RECEIVES \$6,200 FOR BOOTH SUMMER PROGRAM

After a year hiatus due to COVID-19. the Booth Summer Program is back. Foxboro Recreation is once again running their popular eight-week summer program, welcoming 250 children to enjoy days filled with activities and socializing with new and old friends. The program opened June 21, welcoming back Foxborough children ages 5 through 12 to participate in a variety of activities including field games, arts and crafts and nature walks.

In support of these efforts, the PIP Fund granted Foxboro Recreation \$6,200 to cover the cost of new playground sand and safety mulch for two playgrounds, as well as 12 pop-up tents. These tents will assist the Recreation Department in following COVID-19 safety protocols, keeping each group of children socially distanced and protected from the hot summer sun for the duration of camp.

"The generosity of PIP has allowed us to create safer playing surfaces and shade as we continue our goal to send kids home dirty, tired and happy," said Recreation Director Debbie Giardino. "These funds are truly appreciated as COVID-19 significantly impacted our ability to run programs and fundraise and we are so happy to be back. Foxboro Rec is proud of its relationship with PIP and the Kraft organization and appreciate their willingness to partner with us to help the kids of Foxborough have a safe, happy and healthy summer."

The evening opened with an in-depth discussion with Dave Ziegler, a fellow resident and integral member of the Patriots player personnel department.
